

# Human mobility in disaster contexts

#### Multiple challenges:

- Large numbers: 24+ mio newly displaced p.a.
- Multiple forms: Planned relocation, migration, displacement (internal/cross-border)
- Multiple causes: Hazards, demography, socio-economic factors, governance, etc.
- Multiple vulnerabilities: Women, children, indigenous communities, etc.
- A cross-cutting issue: Migration management, climate change, DRR, development, human rights, etc.

# When do people have to move?

Hazard + Exposure + Vulnerability
