Invest in MOOCs to facilitate integration through education (e.g. *Kiron University*)

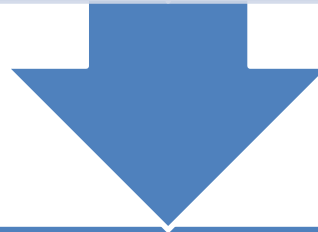
